On Exercising Mercy

*Jesus said to St. Faustina (Entry #742):
“I am giving three ways of exercising mercy towards your neighbor; the first - by deed, the second - by word, the third - by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to My mercy. Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of My mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works.”*

Chaplet Opening Prayer

(L) You expired Jesus, but the source of life poured forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

(ALL) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in you. **(Repeat 3 times)**

(L) Our Father, (All) Give us this day

(L) Hail Mary, (All) Holy Mary,.....

(L) I believe in God the Father...

(All) I believe in the Holy Spirit.....

Praying the Chaplet

(Each Decade)

(L) Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ,

(R) In atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. (“Our Father” Bead)

(L) For the sake of His sorrowful passion

(R) Have mercy on us & on the whole world.
 (“Hail Mary” Beads)

Doxology

(All): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, Have Mercy on us and on the whole world. (Three Times)

Jesus, I trust in you (three times)

Chaplet Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless, and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy Itself. Amen.

Conditions for Plenary Indulgence

(Pope St. John Paul II)

1. Sacramental confession.
2. Eucharistic communion on Divine Mercy Sunday.
3. Prayer for the intentions of the Pope.
4. A spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even venial.
5. Take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy, or, who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (exposed or reserved in the tabernacle), recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!)"

Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy. ... Through the chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will.”
